



General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

What is it?

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) (EU) 2016/679 is a regulation in EU law on data protection and privacy for all individuals within the European Union and the European Economic Area. It also addresses the export of personal data outside the EU and EEA. The GDPR aims primarily to give control to citizens and residents over their personal data and to simplify the regulatory environment for international business by unifying the regulation within the EU.

What kind of information do we collect from you?

There are only 2 occasions on which we collect information from you: (1) When you choose to sign up via our website to receive notification of our new blog posts and (2) When you book a holiday with us.

(1) When you sign up for our blog posts you provide us with your name and an email address, no other information is demanded. We store receive and store the information you enter.

(2) When you make a booking with us we do ask you to supply some personal information; your name, your address, your nationality, your passport number, details of your travel insurance policy, details of any illnesses or impediments that may impact on your ability to participate in the itinerary (or any part of it) being booked, any medication currently being taken and any dietary requirements you may have.

We may also ask you to provide us with an emergency contact number.

We also require this information for any other members of your travel party who you include on your booking. You should have their consent to provide this information. As you (the booking principal) are our sole point of contact we will ask you to confirm that you have obtained the necessary consent.

Information we DO NOT collect

We **do not** ask you to provide us with your bank or credit card details. Bookings with Wildlife Photography Africa (and Wildlife Photography India) are paid for by personal cheque or bank transfer. To achieve this we provide you with an invoice that contains details of our bank account. You make the payment arrangements and therefore we do not need to collect any financial information from you.

We **do not** automatically collect any information about (or from) your computer when you visit our website; our website does not use cookies.



How do we use your information?

(1) If you have signed up to receive our blog we will notify you by email of each new blog post. We may also, from time to time, notify you by email of special offers that we think may be of interest to you. That is all.

We do not share your email address with anyone, nor do we sell our mailing list.

(2) If you make a booking with us the way in which we use the information you provide is detailed below under the heading 'With whom do we share your information?'.

With whom we share your information?

We will - only when necessary - share your information with the suppliers fulfilling the services for your holiday with us. Information about you is routinely required by airlines, hotels, lodges and activity organisers.

By making a booking with us you are authorizing us to disclose to suppliers the information required to complete the booking and deliver the related travel. These suppliers are not controlled by us and personal information disclosed to them is subject to the applicable supplier's privacy policy and security practices.

We also may share your information:

- In response to subpoenas, court orders, or other legal process; to establish or exercise our legal rights; to defend against legal claims; or as otherwise required by law. In such cases we reserve the right to raise or waive any legal objection or right available to us.
- When we believe it is appropriate to investigate, prevent, or take action regarding illegal or suspected illegal activities; to protect and defend the rights, property, or safety of our company or this website, our customers, or others; and in connection with our Terms of Service and other agreements.
- In connection with a corporate transaction, such as a divestiture, merger, consolidation, or asset sale, or in the unlikely event of bankruptcy.

Other than as set out above, you will be notified when personal information about you will be shared with third parties, and you will have an opportunity to choose not to have us share such information.

We also may share aggregate or anonymous information with third parties, including advertisers and investors. For example, we may tell our advertisers the number of visitors our website receives or the most popular hotels and vacation destinations. This



information does not contain any personal information and is used to develop content and services we hope you will find of interest.

How can you access your information?

Your name and email address is stored on our website under your user profile. You can access this at any time simply by logging in to your profile. You can amend or delete the information held there at any time.

How do we protect your information?

Apart from your name and email address, any information we hold is stored offline and is not accessible via our website. We employ firewalls and intrusion detection systems to help prevent unauthorized persons from gaining access to your information.
